

College Bound Graduates Abound

OUR COLLEGE BOUND PROGRAM ENSURES that a student's success is not determined by his or her zip code or access to resources. We support students throughout their high school careers, to graduation, and beyond by providing mentors that help each of them build an individualized plan for his or her future and a path forward to thrive.

College Bound is a free, yearround college and career readiness program that provides high school students with one-on-one academic advisement and career exploration to help them plan for the future, whether that includes a four-year university, community college, trade school, or the military. Members receive individualized support. mentoring, and resources to ensure they graduate high school ready for a successful college experience and with a career plan. For many of the students in the program who are the first in their families to pursue a higher education, this guidance is invaluable.


The Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Orange Coast launched College Bound at the beginning of the 2014-15 school year. During its inaugural year, the program served 47 high school students with 11 graduating seniors. College Bound nearly tripled in size the following year, with a total of 125 participants and 24 graduates. Last year, it tripled again, serving 370 teens and 42 graduating seniors. This year, the program served over 900 high school students and graduated 113 seniors.

On Saturday, May 19, we held our annual College Bound Graduation Ceremony at our Club in Santa Ana to honor and applaud the nearly 60 participating seniors in attendance. As each student crossed the stage, his or her name was announced along with the college or university the student will attend in the fall. Additionally, during the event, we awarded \$40,000 in scholarships to 26 of the graduates to help them in their educational pursuits.

Much of this program's incredible growth and success is due to those who are champions for College Bound. This group is made up of community partners, including the 10 high schools in the cities of Santa Ana and Orange where we currently provide College Bound services on campus, as well as financial supporters, such as Draper Family Foundation, Hartman-Baldwin, Joe MacPherson Foundation, Keith Swayne, Marisla Foundation, PIMCO

Foundation, Taco Bell, and many others. Thank you!

To become Youth of the Year, nominees go through a rigorous process with an essay application and a panel interview comprised of Board Members and Strategic Partners. Picking one outstanding teen is always a difficult decision, but it's also really rewarding to see all that our teens have accomplished thus far in their young lives and to hear about their goals for the future.

We are excited to announce this year's Youth of the Year: Miguel Marquez.

A senior at Middle College High School in Santa Ana, Miguel has been simultaneously enrolled in high school and community college classes for the past two years. In June, he will graduate with both a high school diploma from Middle College High School and an associate of arts degree from Santa Ana College.

In addition to his dual coursework, he is currently class president and works two jobs to help support his family. Last year, he founded and was president of a social activist club at his school called Minority Empowerment Through Awareness--an avenue for minority students, like him, to voice their concerns and feel a sense of empowerment. He is also actively involved in the Volleyball Club, Eco Club, and Wizards for Water, which raises money for water in Africa.

On top of all this, he maintains a 4.4 GPA and a drive to reach for greatness!

This fall, Miguel will attend University of California,
Berkeley to study public policy.
He hopes to be a voice for those



who are afraid to speak up and to inspire America's youth.

"Miguel has proven that he is a true leader who has developed the skills to guarantee himself a successful future. He is resilient and knows how to overcome any and all obstacles. His success is possible because of his strong work ethic and his abilities to think critically and collaborate with others. Miguel believes in himself and is determined to achieve the American Dream," said Rafael Ramos, Miguel's American History teacher and Associated Student Body (ASB) Advisor.

With two older siblings, Miguel is the first in his family to go to college. He attributes some of his success to the support he receives from the Boys & Girls Club. He said, "My parents work hard to give me all they can, but sometimes things I need are out of reach. Whether it be for academic or emotional support, the Boys &

Girls Club has been my constant safety net. Through the Club, I have been privileged to have access to computers for school work, staff for mentorship, academic assistance, and motivation...and there is always something to eat."

As Youth of the Year, Miguel received a \$3,000 scholarship to use toward his college education. Our Youth of the Year runners-up each received a \$1,000 scholarship.
